

4- To encourage sports activities teams should be sent to participate in intercollegiate tournaments organized by the University .Besides, efforts should be made to organize one intercollegiate event in the college.

5-Students, through NSS, shall be motivated to take part in social awareness programmes.

To give a conducive environment flower pots shall be placed around gallery and a white wash should be given to old building of the college.
