For solid waste management, the college has segregated waste collection bins placed throughout the campus, clearly marking separate bins for biodegradable and non-biodegradable waste. Biodegradable waste is directed towards composting facilities, promoting waste-to-compost practices, while non-biodegradable materials, such as plastics and metals, are regularly collected for recycling through designated vendors.

In terms of liquid waste management, the college has an efficient sewage treatment system in place. Wastewater from restrooms, and other facilities is treated in a sewage treatment plant (STP) before being safely discharged or reused for non-potable purposes, such as irrigation. This helps reduce water pollution and conserve water resources.

Obsolete or damaged electronic devices are collected and handed over to Nagarpalika for proper dismantling and recycling, ensuring harmful substances do not pollute the environment. Govt. PG College Berinag has implemented comprehensive systems for the management of solid waste, liquid waste, and e-waste, ensuring environmental sustainability on campus.

For solid waste management, the college has segregated waste collection bins placed throughout the campus, clearly marking separate bins for biodegradable and non-biodegradable waste. Biodegradable waste is directed towards composting facilities, promoting waste-to-compost practices, while non-biodegradable materials, such as plastics and metals, are regularly collected for recycling through designated vendors.

In terms of liquid waste management, the college has an efficient sewage treatment system in place. Wastewater from restrooms, and other facilities is treated in a sewage treatment plant (STP) before being safely discharged or reused for non-potable purposes, such as irrigation. This helps reduce water pollution and conserve water resources.

For the management of e-waste, the college follows a responsible disposal policy. Obsolete or damaged electronic devices are collected and handed over to Nagarpalika for proper dismantling and recycling, ensuring harmful substances do not pollute the environment.
